WELCOME TO A NEW 4-H YEAR

IT IS TIME TO RE-ENROLL IN 4-H AND INVITE NEW FAMILIES TO JOIN.

OCTOBER 1ST- BOTH RE-ENROLLMENT AND NEW ENROLLMENT FOR THE 2024-2025

4-H YEAR BEGINS ON OCTOBER 1 AND CLOSES ON JANUARY 1.

- TIPS FOR ENROLLMENT- FIRST TIMERS AND OLD TIMERS. EVERYONE, MEMBERS, CLOVERBUDS AND LEADERS NEED TO RE-ENROLL EACH YEAR.
- IF LEADERS ALLOW THEIR ENROLLMENT TO LAPSE ONE YEAR, THEY WILL HAVE TO COMPLETE A NEW BACKGROUND CHECK.
- ATTEND YOUR OCTOBER 4-H CLUB MEETING WITH YOUR PARENTS
- READ THE 4-H PROJECT CLOVER MAGAZINE
- READ THE DESCRIPTION OF ALL PROJECTS YOU PLAN ON ENROLLING IN
- READ ALL THE INSERTS IN THE CLOVER MAGAZINE
- IF YOU ARE A FIRST YEAR MEMBER, CLOVERBUD OR LEADER, ENTER A 1 FOR YEARS IN 4-H
- MEMBERS THAT HAVE BEEN ENROLLED AS CLOVERBUDS START THEIR 4-H YEARS OVER AS A FIRST-YEAR MEMBER
- CAREFULLY READ THE 4-H ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT WITH YOUR PARENTS AND UNDERSTAND WHAT YOU ARE SIGNING. YOUR ENROLLMENT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED BY THE EXTENSION OFFICE UNTIL YOUR AGREEMENT FORM IS TURNED IN TO THE OFFICE
- CAREFULLY READ THE ZSUITES ENROLLMENT INSTRUCTIONS INSERTED IN THE CLOVER MAGAZINE. IF YOU ARE RE-ENROLLING, YOU DO NOT CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT, YOU LOG INTO YOUR EXISTING ACCOUNT.
- REMEMBER, THE WAY YOU ENTER INFORMATION IS HOW IT WILL SHOW UP ON ALL 4-H REPORTS, FORMS, PROGRAMS, AND COMMUNICATIONS. CHECK YOUR SPELLING, ONLY CAPITALIZE THE FIRST LETTER OF YOUR NAME, MAKE SURE TO ENTER EMAIL, TELEPHONE AND MAILING ADDRESSES CORRECTLY.

ONCE AGAIN, YOU WILL GO TO THE ZSUITE WEBSITE HTTPS://4H.ZSUITE.ORG/ ENTER THE PRIMARY USERS EMAIL ADDRESS AND PASSWORD.

- YOU WILL LOG INTO THE PRIMARY PERSONS ACCOUNT AND ENTER YOUR PIN NUMBER.
- REMEMBER, YOU CAN ASK THE PROGRAM TO REMEMBER BOTH YOUR PASSWORD AND PIN, THEN IT WILL BE THERE AS LONG AS YOU ARE ON THE SAME COMPUTER.
- ONCE YOU HAVE THE PRIMARY PROFILE OPEN YOU WILL CLICK ON THE ARROW ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF EACH PERSON'S BOX AND CLICK ON CONTINUE TO ENROLLMENT FOR EACH PERSON. YOU WILL UPDATE ALL INFORMATION, THIS YEAR YOU WILL NEED TO ADD PARENTS' NAMES, PHONES AND EMAIL. IF POSSIBLE, PLEASE USE CELL NUMBERS HERE.
- NEXT YOU WILL COMPLETE AND THE WAIVERS. WHEN YOU GET TO THE CLUB SCREEN, YOU WILL ADD A CLUB IF YOU ARE NEW. RETURNING MEMBERS MAY CHOOSE TO STAY IN THE SAME CLUB OR DELETE THAT CLUB AND ADD ANOTHER.

- NEXT YOU WILL CHOOSE YOUR PROJECTS FOR THIS YEAR. ALL MEMBERS, PLEASE ADD MONTANA 4-H YEAR BOOK, SO
 YOUR MY 4-H YEAR RECORD WILL BE CREATED FOR YOU. FOR YOUR OTHER PROJECTS IT IS VERY IMPORTANT TO READ
 THE PROJECT DESCRIPTIONS IN THE CLOVER PROJECT SELECTION GUIDE, SO YOU ENROLL CORRECTLY. CLOVERBUDS
 WILL ONLY CHOOSE THE CLOVERBUD PROJECT, BUDS ARE NOT REQUIRED TO DO RECORD BOOK.
- LAST OF ALL YOU WILL GO TO CHECK OUT YOU MAY EITHER PAY ONLINE (\$1 FEE) OR CHECK SUBMIT AND PAY IN PERSON. YOU MAY MAIL A CHECK, MADE OUT TO FERGUS/PETROLEUM 4-H,
- TO THE FERGUS COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE, 712 WEST MAIN, SUITE 110, LEWISTOWN MT 59457 OR STOP BY THE OFFICE LOCATED ON BROADWAY BEHIND THE COURTHOUSE.
- YOU CLUB LEADERS WILL BE HANDING OUT THE YEARLY ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT
- AT YOUR OCTOBER MEETING. WE NEED THAT FORM SIGNED BY YOU AND A PARENT BEFORE WE CAN ACCEPT YOUR ENROLLMENT.

REMINDER- WORKBOOKS/PROJECT BOOKS FOR 2024-2025 YEAR

DURING THE LAST LEADER'S COUNCIL MEETING, IT WAS DECIDED TO MAKE WORKBOOKS OPTIONAL. WE ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGING THAT YOU DO THE WORKBOOKS FOR AT LEAST ONE YEAR IF YOU ARE STARTING A NEW PROJECT. IF YOU CHOOSE TO CONTINUE DOING THE WORKBOOKS YOU WILL HAVE THE OPTION TO ENTER THEM IN THE FAIR FOR AN OPPORTUNITY TO EARN A RIBBON. PROJECT WORKBOOKS FOR SPECIAL AWARDS SUCH AS THE SUPER BUCKLE WILL STILL BE REQUIRED. IF YOU WANT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SUPER BUCKLE, YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO FILE THIS WITH THE EXTENSION OFFICE BY APRIL 15TH (FORM WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THE EXTENSION OFFICE).

THE LEADER'S COUNCIL WILL STILL PROVIDE THE WORKBOOKS FOR THOSE WHO WOULD LIKE TO USE THEM. WHEN YOU ARE SIGNING UP FOR THE NEW YEAR, PLEASE MAKE SURE TO MARK IT IN THE PROJECT AREA IF YOU WANT A WORKBOOK. IF YOU ARE OPTING TO NOT DO THEM, PLEASE DO NOT MARK THAT YOU WANT ONE.

POLICY CHAGES

POLICY CHANGES WILL BE VOTED ON AT THE UPCOMING MEETINGS, EXCEPT FOR SMALL ANIMALS.

• PLEASE SEE THE PROPOSED POLICY CHANGES IN THIS NEWSLETTER. ALL CLUB LEADERS AND ENROLLED 4-H MEMBERS HAVE VOTING POWER AT MEETINGS.

LIVESTOCK

NEXT MEETING- NOVEMBER 12TH 6PM SHERIFF'S COMPLEX

- INCREASE THE PERCENTAGE TAKEN OUT OF LIVESTOCK SALE CHECKS FROM 3% TO 5% IN ORDER TO BUILD THE LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE ACCOUNT.
- NO PERSONAL SPEAKERS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE LIVESTOCK BARNS. MUSIC WILL NEED TO BE PLAYED OVER THE P.A. SYSTEM AND BE APPROVED BY THE EXTENSION OFFICE.
- ALL MARKET LAMBS WILL BE SLICK SHEARED WITHIN TWO WEEKS OF THE SHOW DATE AT THE CENTRAL MONTANA FAIR. THIS WOULD INCLUDE WOOL ON FACE, LEGS, AND BELLY. ANY LAMBS NOT MEETING THIS REQUIREMENT WILL BE PLACED AT THE BOTTOM OF THE CLASS BY DEFAULT.
- THE LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE MAY SPLIT CLASSES INTO WEIGHT DIVISIONS, WITH NO FEWER THAN 5 ANIMALS PER WEIGHT DIVISION. WHERE THE OLD RULE WAS NO FEWER THAN 7 ANIMALS.
- ADD LOT 2 FERGUS-PETROLEUM BORN AND RAISED SHOWCASE. LAMBS THAT ARE IN-COUNTY BORN AND BRED CAN BE CROSSED ENTERED IN THIS LOT TO BE JUDGED AGAINST OTHER LOCALLY GROWN LAMBS FOR AN OVERALL "LOCALLY BORN AND RAISED" PRIZE.
- REMOVAL OF THE SUPER AWARD.

- ID CARDS WILL NOW BE REQUIRED FOR ALL SMALL ANIMALS. THIS WILL ENSURE THAT EXHIBITORS ARE SHOWING ANIMALS THAT BELONG TO THEM THROUGHOUT THE 4-H YEAR. ANIMALS UNDER THIS NEW RULE INCLUDE POULTRY, CAT, RABBIT, POCKET PET, AND DOG.
- MARKET POULTRY WILL NOW BE BROKEN INTO SPECIES FOR MORE FAIR JUDGING.
 EXAMPLES WILL INCLUDE CHICKENS: MEAT, CHICKENS: EGG, TURKEYS, DUCKS, ECT.
- MARKET BROILER CHICKENS WILL NOW BE A PEN OF 2.

Spotlight

Local 4-H student makes National Congress

Hard work and many hours have paid off for this 4H member. Kylie Crawford has earned herself a place at National 4H Congress in Atlanta, GA this November, where she will be able to network and attend many educational workshops with other 4-H members from across the US.

National 4-H Congress started in 1920 as an educational tour for about 100 members to come together, exchange ideas, participate in community service and receive recognition for accomplishments. Now the National 4-H Congress reaches upward of 100,000 4-H members, leaders, and extension staff. Kylie is a second generation attendee of the National 4-H Congress. Both her mom and dad have attended during their 4-H career.

Kylie, a sophomore in high school, is a seven-year 4H member. Kylie has been in the quilting project for six years. This year was her second year attending and entering a quilt at our state Congress competition in July. This year her quilt placed first among nine other very competitive quilts.

Kylie, a very avid book reader, wanted to make a

bookshelf quilt. She began browsing Pinterest looking for ideas. She came across this quilt pattern inspired by Harry Potter.

"It drew my attention because it combines my interests, reading, fantasy, and quilting," she said. "I loved the knickknacks that make this so much more fun than a simple bookshelf quilt."

For those that don't know much about quiltingm, some patterns are done in blocks. This quilt pattern offered many different avenues in which to design it. If she did a block a week which this pattern was set up to do, it would have taken her seven months to do just the block portion of the quilt. There are 30 blocks total in her quilt. One block she assembled has 71 pieces of fabric in it (the hand holding a candle).

"One of the hardest things in paper piecing blocks is lining up the seam lines like I did with the owl and the hat," Kylie explained. "One of my favorite blocks is the eye that is looking through a hole in the back of the shelf. Most fabrics were pulled from the scrap bin because I only needed a small amount of each. But I did purchase a few fabrics like the dragon skin book fabric. I wanted fabrics that had a different texture, so I had to learn how to use synthetic fibers. Many of these have a different ironing temperature and I had to figure out how to work with them."

When Kylie couldn't find the exact material she wanted for her design, she created her own fabric colors with inktense pencils that can be used on fabric and will not wash out. She used these to add a swirl to the crystal ball and the flame on the candle.

Kylie put in 300 hours to making this beautiful quilt. A few things that made her quilt stand out against her competition was the quilting. The quilting had to be independently designed, which meant drawing out on the computer the individual castle bricks, cross hatching to fit the shelving as well as adding the wood grain on the wood part of the bookshelf itself. Each part of the quilting was tailored specifically for the different parts of the quilt.

The quilt will be hanging through the end of November at the Lewistown Public Library.
