lobbed leaf - A leaf having deeply indented marginsmargin - Leaf edge or border.



opposite - An opposite arrangement is when the leaves are arranged on a stem directly across from one another.

simple leaf - Leaf having a singular, basic shape, such as a heart, triangle or oval.

serrated leaf - A leaf having a margin notched like a saw with teeth pointing toward the apex.

taxonomy - Grouping of organisms: the science of classifying plants, animals, and microorganisms into increasingly broader categories based on shared features.

whirled - A whorled arrangement is when 3 or more leaves are attached at a node along a stem.

Vocabulary

alternate stem or leaf - An alternate arrangement is when the leaves are arranged in an alternating fashion along a stem.

broadleaf tree or shrub - Having relatively broad flat leaves and flowers. Many are deciduous and do not have showy flowers.


compound leaf - A leaf with more than one blade. All blades are attached to a single leaf stem. Simply, a compound leaf is composed of a number of leaflets on a common stalk.

conifer tree or shrub - Having needle-shaped or scalelike leaves. Mostly evergreen trees and shrubs and have cones.

deciduous tree or shrub - Trees or shrubs that loose their leaves each year.




