

Gallatin County 4-H Ambassador Application

A 4-H Ambassador is an official envoy, an authorized representative of the Montana State 4-H Program. A 4-H Ambassador is a self-motivated, enthusiastic youth leader who promotes 4-H using skills, knowledge and leadership abilities acquired in 4-H with 4-H members, area residents, community leaders, elected officials, and non-4-H youth. A 4-H Ambassador serves to strengthen the 4-H program through public relations.

Being an Ambassador is an honor and a privilege. Being chosen as an Ambassador entails the acceptance of "great" responsibility and a total commitment to the Gallatin County 4-H Ambassador program.

This application for Gallatin County 4-H Ambassador is due to the County Office by November 1st of the year that they want to be considered for the Ambassador program.

Ambassador Qualifications:

- 1. Must be 14 years of age by October 1st of the current 4-H year.
- 2. Must be enrolled in 4-H for at least 2 years and must be enrolled in 4-H for the current year.
- 3. Must apply and be interviewed.
- 4. Must be enthusiastic about 4-H as demonstrated by participation, leadership, example and other similar experiences.
- 5. Must have the time available to fulfill the role of an Ambassador. Ambassadors must be willing to make the Ambassador program a top priority.
- 6. Must be responsible.
- 7. Must be willing to attend Ambassador Meetings and training sessions offered by the county and state (when applicable). These include Fall Leadership Training and State Congress, and a minimum of monthly meetings.
- 8. Must have parent and/or guardian support.
- 9. Must have County Agent staff support.
- 10. Must be capable and willing to get out of school on a limited basis for special programs (ex. Fall Leadership Training or Rec Lab).
- 11. Must be willing to serve out the Ambassador term.
- 12. Always uphold the 4-H Ambassador image, this includes all activities outside of 4-H also.

Ambassadors:

- 1. Will be selected for each 4-H year by a committee made of 3 or more of the following 4-H Extension Agent, Council representative, Foundation representative, and other 4-H volunteers. Ambassadors must apply each year by application and an interview. Selection will be completed by the committee.
- 2. Must reapply and go through the application process to be selected as an Ambassador for the next year.
- 3. Are expected to be part of the Ambassador team and work together to fulfill the responsibilities in the county plan of action.
- 4. May be discharged at any time if their behavior is not becoming of Ambassador ideals.



Ambassador Expectations and Duties:

- Enroll in the Teen Leadership Project.
- Able and willing to attend Ambassador meetings and trainings.
- Work as a team to complete the duties and expectations of Ambassadors.
- Represent 4-H in public relation roles.
- Promote 4-H with potential members, parents and the general public.
- Help plan and conduct 4-H events and activities.
- Meet as needed face to face and/or virtually.
- Develop personal leadership skills and self-confidence.
- Recruit new members.
- Encourage financial support for 4-H.
- Work directly with county, district and state 4-H leaders.
- Be aware of your family schedule and be prepared to communicate your availability with the group.
- Be prepared to attend meetings without parental supervision and make decisions.
- Follow through with your commitments. If you are unable to attend an event, be sure and communicate with your fellow Ambassadors and Ambassador Leader.
- Ambassadors will be expected to communicate electronically email, texts, BAND, etc.

Estimated Schedule of Events:

- Attend the majority of Teen Leadership Project monthly meetings
- Attend the majority of Ambassador Team meetings
- Montana 4-H Leadership Academy online trainings
- Montana 4-H Fall Leadership Training (October/November) and/or Montana 4-H Rec Lab (typically March/April – hosting district rotates)
- Montana 4-H State Pre-Congress and/or Congress (July week prior to Gallatin County Fair)
- Big Sky Country State Fair (3rd week of July), may include:
 - Cloverbud project/interview judging
 - Species award ceremonies
 - Family Fun Night (dance, etc)
 - o In-person interviews with TV and/or radio as requested by 4-H Agent
 - o Positive attitude and to volunteer as needed throughout Fair week
 - Market Sale Buyer Appreciation BBQ
 - o Round Robin Showmanship Competition
- National 4-H Week Promotion (first week of Oct.)
- 4-H Family Orientations (usually Sept./Oct.)
