Montana 4-H People Partner grants - start planning now!

These grants provide incentives and financial support to groups and individuals for programs that enhance the quality of living for people in their communities.

Application Deadline: Postmarked by February 1st Each application is eligible for up to \$500.

Eligibility

4-H groups and individual members may apply. Grants are also open to non-4-H youth groups and individuals. Applications should meet the following criteria:

- Youth should be involved in determining, planning, conducting, and evaluating the project.
- Project will make it possible for people to accomplish something educational and worthwhile that helps them reach a higher quality of life.
- There is community support and acceptance of the project, as evidence by "partners" listed in the grant application, additional funding sources, and resource persons and agencies involved.
- The project has lasting benefits.

If a group, club, committee, etc. is interested in applying, please chat with Kari or Lisa now to begin planning. In recent years these projects have helped fund fleece tie blankets, herdsmanship banner in the Rabbit/Poultry barn, wash rack project, new show ring at Seewald barn, and more. 

Beef Weigh-Ins

Members will have three options for weighing in steers:

- Friday, December 1 Wade and Leslie Berkram's 9 a.m. (1396 Reagan Road)
- Friday, December 1- Richie and Andee Laverdures 10:30 a.m. (506 E. Sweetgrass Road)
- Saturday, December 2 Hibbs Livestock 9 a.m. (101 Pendergrass Road)

Please let Kari know if you'll be weighing in at Berkrams or Laverdures as cell service is spotty and we don't want to miss anyone.

The minimum weight for 2025 Marias Fair is 1,100 pounds; max pay weight is 1,500 pounds, select steers accordingly. Each exhibitor may weigh in one spare animal/species. If doing a pen of three, four market animals may be weighed in. Any breeding animals must have the 4-H Clover tattoo OR Association registration tattoo OR Bangs vaccination tattoo by the official hog weigh-in deadline (which will be in April 2025). So, if you are doing a breeding project, your animal does not need to be weighed in at steer weighin but must have an appropriate tattoo by April.

All steers must be dehorned before weigh-in, as horned steers are NOT allowed at the fair. Also, ensure your steer has been fully castrated and is not a stag. All steers must have been born after January 1, 2024. 4-Her must be 10 as of Oct. 1 to show a market beef animal.

Information to bring to weigh-in:

- Steer's birth date
- Breed of steer (including percentages of each breed)
- Breeder's name and mailing address

Beef members, as you are purchasing steers, please be sure to get a Bill of Sale as this will be needed at the fair. Unless the steer is from the 4-Her's immediate family (father/mother), they need to have a Bill of Sale indicating a Change of Ownership. A Bill of Sale IS needed if purchasing from cousins, uncles, aunts, grandparents, neighbors, etc. They are also encouraged to have a Show Cattle Permit as well for transportation purposes. At the Marias Fair weigh-in in July, 4-Hers will be asked to sign a "ranch raised affidavit" if their steer is from their family.

If you have any questions on what is needed or need to get a Brand Inspection, please call Jeff Jergens, district brand inspector, at 406-450-0001, or local brand inspectors Chad Scarborough at 406-470-0712 or Tom Seifert at 406-873-5700. Please bring your Bill of Sale to December weighins so that we can make sure you have it. We will try to have some extra Bill of Sale forms available at our December weigh-ins if anyone needs as well.

Livestock Financing Limits have Increased

If you are looking for a way to finance your 4-H projects for this year, consider visiting with the Farm Service Agency. They recently increased the loan limit to \$10,000 and funds can be used for the purchase of animals, feed, supplies, etc. Youth between the ages of 10 and 20 are eligible. Loans are repaid annually and can be termed out for up to seven years for the purchase of breeding stock. The interest rate is currently 5.25%.
