

# Troy state's first BPA municipal customer

MISSOULA (AP) — Troy, a city of about 1,100, has become the Bonneville Power Administration's first municipal customer in Montana.

BPA began supplying electricity this week to the newly chartered Troy municipal electrical system, the agency said in a press release.

Troy recently purchased the distribution system from Montana Power & Light. Voters in November

approved a measure that changed the city's charter to make possible the purchase and power sales contract with BPA, according to the release.

BPA said it will supply about four megawatts power to Troy. Temporary service to the utility will be provided over ML&P's transmission lines, and through Pacific Power & Light's Libby Substation.
