

OPPORTUNITIES FOR CITIZENSHIP TRIPS APPLICATION AND BILL DUE DECEMBER 17, 2024

Each year 4-H members are offered exciting opportunities to participate in Citizenship trips designed to educate and inspire youth to learn and experience our State and country's governmental processes. Delegates participate in a mock trial, create and debate bills, meet with elected officials, and participate in service learning projects.

Yellowstone County sends individuals to the Montana Citizenship Seminar in Helena and 3

individuals to Washington Focus in Washington, D.C. The Yellowstone County 4-H Council and the Yellowstone County 4-H Foundation help to pay the expenses for delegates from our county to attend both Citizenship Helena and Washington D.C. Focus.

Yellowstone County Extension Office

CITIZENSHIP HELENA – January 19 – 21, 2025 (4-H'er's 13 and older by October 1, 2024)

Offers a close-up view of the State's political process. Participants will meet with senators and representatives to discuss issues, visit historical sites, and attend workshops focused on teaching life skills, policies, and possible solutions to domestic problems. You will interact with 4-H members from across the State that may have different customs, interests, and values. You will study many aspects of citizenship and how you as a responsible citizen can have an effect on your community, your State, and your nation.

<u>CITIZENSHIP WASHINGTON (D.C.) FOCUS</u> – June or July (4-Her's 14 and older by October 1, 2024) This program takes place in Washington, D.C. Attendees will hear from motivational speakers and participate in educational workshops that increase individual leadership capability and build lifetime skills for success. Attendees will tour the White House, National Archives, Presidential and war monuments/memorials, Smithsonian Museum, and much more.

To be considered as a delegate for any trip, members must write a bill and participate in Citizenship Interviews. It is recommended that participants attend the Citizenship Seminar in Helena prior to going to either Washington D.C. but it is not mandatory.

What is involved in the Citizenship Interviews?

- 1) You must complete and send your application to the Extension Office by 5:00 PM December 17, 2024.
- 2) You must prepare a bill and return it with your application by December 17. A sample bill and bill writing instructions are enclosed. You can call the Extension Office for help or attend the Bill Writing Workshop (see next page) November 20.
- 3) You will be asked questions about why you wrote the bill, resources used to develop the bill, etc.
- 4) You will be asked questions about your own citizenship experiences and how a bill becomes a law. We will mail information to you on these topics after we receive your application.
- 5) Interviews will be held on December 19, 2024.

How to Write a Bill

Each participant is required to write at least one bill prior to the 4-H legislature at the Citizenship Seminar.

Set up your Bill as a letter size (8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide by 11" high) portrait document. Try to keep your Bill to one page or less and double space all lines.

A Bill should be formatted as follows:

Line 1	Legislative chamber and bill number (4-H Bill No)		
Line 2	Your name should appear after (Introduced by)			
Line 3	Leave blank			
Line 4	Intent statement (Start on line 4 using as many lines as necessary)			
Line *	Should state as follows: (BE IT ENACTED BY THE 4-H CITIZENSHIP SEMINAR OF THIS STATE OF MONTANA:)			
Line *	First statement of the bill labeled: (SECTION 1)			
Line *	Second statement of the bill labeled: (SECTION 2) conclude with "Effective date is upon passage and approval" unless otherwise stated.

To change Montana School Law regarding Adult Education to allow students under certain circumstances
to enroll in Adult Education classes offered by school districts.
(BE IT ENACTED BY THE 4-H CITIZENSHIP SEMINAR OF THE STATE OF MONTANA)
(SECTION 1)
Students 14 years and older who are regularly enrolled in public or private high schools may enroll in
Adult Education classes offered by school districts. Preference would be given to those persons 16 years
and older who are not regularly enrolled, full-time pupils for the purposes of ANB computation.
Regular students could only attend classes if space permitted and their attendance was approved by the
local school district.
