Please be certain to read all rules and policies for MontanaFair – it is your responsibility to read the handbook. Please refer to Department A and Department N Handbooks to determine what divisions and classes you should be entering.

REGISTER FOR THE 2026 CLOVERBUD CAMP

Registration for the Thursday, July 16, 2026, Cloverbud Camp "America's 250th Birthday" is now open in ZSuite under "Events". Registration and payment deadline is 11:59 pm Wednesday, July 8.

The camp fee is \$10 and covers snacks, lunch, supplies and accident insurance. You can pay online at the time of registration or make payment in the Extension office by 5:00 pm Wednesday, July 8.

Please plan to have your Cloverbud at camp by 9:30 am and pick them up by 3:00 pm. Dress in appropriate clothing for the day (sunscreen, hat, jacket, and tennis shoes). Please pack a second set of clothes – the kids will get wet! Activities are planned for both indoor and outdoor activities.

MONTANAFAIR INFORMATION NIGHT

Fair is just around the corner, and it can be overwhelming especially if you are in your first couple of years or maybe you want to try something new and are not even sure where to start. Many people do not know that there are things you can do in both departments.

There will be a fair information meeting on Tuesday, June 2 at 6:00 pm in the 4-H building. This is a great chance for new families to come and learn what opportunities there are and how to get involved. We will cover both Department N (non-livestock) and Department A (all livestock/animals) with time for questions and answers.

MONTANAFAIR ENTRIES ARE COMPLETED ONLINE- PLEASE READ

MontanaFair entries are completed online at the [MontanaFair website](https://www.montanafair.com/) or <https://www.montanafair.com/>.

Department A and Department N MontanaFair Handbooks can be found there or on the County 4-H website under the MontanaFair heading. Those without internet capabilities can make an appointment to come to the Extension office and use a computer to complete your online entry.

MontanaFair will assess a \$20 exhibitor fee when you enter online. This fee will be paid with a credit card or debit card. Cloverbuds do not pay the fee. All 2026 entries must be completed and submitted online before 11:59 pm Friday, June 26, to avoid an additional late fee of \$50 per exhibitor. Late entries must be completed and submitted online before 11:59 pm Friday, July 3.

All late fees must be paid via a check made payable to Yellowstone County 4-H Council and mailed or dropped off to the Yellowstone County Extension office by 5:00 pm Friday, July 17.

There are no exceptions to any entry deadlines.

Parents of exhibitors need to purchase gate admission tickets online at the time of entry. Tickets are \$6 each and must be paid when submitting the entry. The process will be new this year. Directions from MontanaFair will be available soon and emailed to everyone. Enrolled leaders will complete the Yellowstone County 4-H Volunteer/Project Leader Participation Requirement Form in their ZSuite profile under Events; to determine the number of tickets they will receive for gate admission at MontanaFair.

Department A and N worksheets can be printed off the [Yellowstone County 4-H website](https://www.montana.edu/extension/yellowstone/4h/index.html) at <https://www.montana.edu/extension/yellowstone/4h/index.html>. You can fill these out when viewing the handbooks BEFORE you complete your online entry at www.montanafair.com. This can save you time.

Members can only enter in projects in which they are enrolled, including all livestock projects.

In Department N (non-livestock), and Department A (livestock) members may lose their premium money if they scratch more than 4 entry items. If you plan to enter a livestock showmanship class, you MUST put it on your entry - you cannot add it at fair. The divisions you can enter are beginner, junior or senior.

Please visit the Yellowstone County website for the Department N and A schedules. Items may be added (e.g., club workshops).

All Yellowstone County pre-fair events must be included in your Department N (Showcase, Communication Day, County Shoot) or Department A (Cat Show, Dog Show) entry. If your pre-fair county events are not included in your entry, you will not receive premium money for those exhibits.

Be sure you have entered what you want to before submitting your entry. Write down your exact sign on information - you will need it to make changes to your MontanaFair entry. Print a copy of your completed entry form so you know what you have entered.

ARE YOU NEEDING HELP SUBMITTING YOUR MONTANAFAIR ENTRY?

If you need assistance with your MontanaFair entry, contact Stephanie Johnson at the Extension office to set up an individual appointment. **DO NOT come to the office without a scheduled appointment.** Please bring a list of projects you plan to sign up for in Department N (non-livestock) and Department A (Livestock). URGENTLY SEEKING INTERNATIONAL HOST FAMILIES FOR JAPANESE DELEGATES

The Montana 4-H International Exchange Programs (MT4HIEP) summer inbound program needs 20-25 host families from July 22 to August 16, 2026. There are 18 youth delegates (9 girls, 9 boys), ages 12-16, and two adult chaperones.

These delegates are here for a homestay to experience American culture and family life. Special trips and tours are not required to host a delegate. These young people are here to be members of your family for a month, not tourists. Is your child going to camp this summer? Send your delegate too! Camp fees are covered by 4-H and the international partner organization. Take them to the grocery store, let them do chores like feeding the animals, take them to 4-H meetings and the Fair! Treat this young person as you treat your own child. The main requirements are that the delegate must have a host sibling of the same gender within four years of their age, their own bed, three meals a day, and adult supervision.

If you attended a Virtual Webex Animal Quality Assurance Class on June 3 at 6:30 pm, you are also required to complete the [Youth for the Quality Care of Animals online course](http://yqcaprogram.org) at <http://yqcaprogram.org>.

Upon successful completion of the quiz, the member will need to download the course certificate. The certificate is proof that the member has completed the AQA course. A copy of the certificate must be emailed, faxed, or mailed to the Yellowstone County Extension office. Certificate must be received (not postmarked by) in the office no later than 5:00 pm, June 26, 2026. No exceptions!

2025-2026 ANIMAL QUALITY ASSURANCE POLICY & WORKSHOP SCHEDULE

All 4–H and FFA members exhibiting any animal in Department A (Junior Livestock) at MontanaFair are required to attend an MSU Extension **ANIMAL QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING (AQA)** (per state guidelines) provided by the 4-H Committee or an FFA Advisor/Agriculture Educator prior to the first MontanaFair entry deadline or exhibitors do not show. A parent or legal guardian must also attend the AQA training with the member. Yellowstone County has two 4-H age brackets for AQA training. Exhibitors must attend AQA as a beginner/Junior member (8-13), and as a senior member (14-19). This age is based on the exhibitors "4-H Age" – their age on of October 1 of the current 4-H year. Exhibitors must take Animal Quality Assurance the first year they reach each age bracket or the first year they exhibit any animal project. Class content is determined by a committee.

There will be hands-on, group activities. Plan to arrive on time with a parent/legal guardian staying for the complete 1½ hours. If you and your parent are not in attendance for the entire session, you may be asked to attend another. Plan to attend an early session to avoid conflicts that may arise later. **NO workshops will be held after the June 3 class. It is the final opportunity for 2026.**

For virtual sessions, attendees must log into a Webex meeting (link will be sent via email prior to each session) to get instructions about how and where to go to complete the online program. The online program requires members to pay a \$12 fee to take the online class. A copy of the completion certificate must be provided to the Extension office.

HORSE ID CARD REQUIREMENTS & POLICY FOR MEMBERS & LEADERS

All MontanaFair 4-H horse exhibitors must turn in a completed Horse ID card with proof of current 4 in 1 vaccination (influenza, tetanus, and eastern and western sleeping sickness) attached to the card. Cards must be turned into exhibitor's horse leader who will verify that the ID card is complete and deliver it to the Extension office with Assessment Result Sheets by June 15. Horse ID cards must be signed by the member, parent, leader and include a picture of the horse and rider. Cards received after the June 15 deadline will not be accepted and horses without completed cards on file will not be allowed to show at MontanaFair. Only one ID card per Horse Project will be accepted. (English and Western Horsemanship are different projects, and two different horses may be used.) The Family Horse ID card is also due on June 15.

HORSE FINAL ASSESSMENTS FOR MONTANAFAIR

4-H members will be assessed at the club level by a horse leader or teen horse leader. The member assessment sheets found in the members' Horsemanship project book should be completed but are not turned into the county office; they are to be kept in the member's record book. The Assessment Results Sheet signed by the horse or organizational leader showing the new levels and projects for all members will be turned into the Extension office. These sheets with all level changes are to be completed by June 15 each year. Members will show in the level above what has been completed. Leaders can decline to assess a member; however, members must be assessed to attend MontanaFair. The member can ask the Horse & Colt Committee for another registered Horse Leader to assess them.
