- Policy Approval Pathway
 - Overview of revised policy review pathway
 - Discussion
 - Will be a change in gathering feedback instead of approval
 - Was redundant, college representatives on UGC
 - Gathering feedback at the same time is a significant improvement
 - Motion to vote by Giullian, Thum seconds
 - Vote: unanimous approval of policy approval pathway
 - Next Steps
 - Get approval in writing from Provost Office
 - Present as informational item to Faculty Senate
- Appeal Policy & Academic Standing Policy (first reading)
 - Overview of changes
 - Academic Standing Policy
 - Corrected policy to match current procedure
 - Separated section for Academic Progress toward degree and clarified process for graduate committees to dismiss students for unsatisfactory degree progress
 - Appeal Policy
 - Clarify process for different types of appeals/policy exception requests
 - Clarified language regarding being dismissed from a graduate program
 - Added criteria for eligibility to appeal dismissals
 - Council members to gather feedback from colleges, move to Faculty Senate for feedback
- Learning Outcomes for 590/690
 - Discussion on implementation and timeline
 - Suggest starting as voluntary guidance and later can make it a formal requirement
 - Important for accreditation, guidance and clear expectations for student, help with time to degree, protecting both the faculty and student, consistency
 - Can provide students a template and they individualize it and review with faculty
 - o Accreditation review mentioned that every class in CIM needs to have a syllabus
 - 590/690/575/592/692 Canvas shell where standard syllabus is available, UGC could create the standard syllabus
 - Warnat will send an email to Tracy Dougher

- Discussion on course approvals in CIM
 - o Chemical Engineering has 690 credits built with traditional letter grade instead of pass/fail
 - Reviewing course approvals and deactivations in CIM
 - o Could the CIM entries be more standardized for research credits?
 - o Curriculum subcommittee will forward agenda to Cerretti to review

 - o Thank you for the feedback on leader of graduate education position
 - Outlined pros/cons and emphasized the need for transparency
 - Discussion
 - Based on feedback, the Provost changed the position title changed to Vice Provost of Graduate Education and Director of Graduate School
