Chair in Native American Studies. (1992-Present). Multi-funding Sources (numerous mini-proposals). \$1,250,000 to date. (\$100,000, Grant from Hearst, 2000.)

AIM (American Indians into Mathematics). (1994-97). Dwight D. Eisenhower Program. U.S. Department of Education. \$550,000 over a three year period.

Community/Native American Scholarship Program. (1994) Direct funding from community member to financial in-need Native American student. Jointly with Mr. Bill Bryan. \$11,000 to date.
